

Results of the NSAC Convention in Phoenix, AZ on October 09-14th, 2022

There were 92 delegates in attendance. Some of our delegates had over 40 years of membership with the NSAC and had attended convention since the 1980s. Over 63 Bylaw amendments were on the docket to discuss, all but 3 were handled by Convention end. The days were long with business discussions and debates. Many of the issues brought by the bylaw amendments were not passed or changed, and even the board only saw two new faces, with the board mainly remaining the same as the last three years.

Our greatest win was that New chartered churches can be online or in-person. This will help churches to develop and grow without the worry of a building fees. So excited to see how many churches will develop.

The biggest issue discussed was the closing and selling of <u>Church of Two Worlds</u>, in Georgetown, Washington, D.C. The church was our last in the DC urban area and the original <u>church founded in 1936 by the Rev. H. Gordon Burroughs</u>.

In 2015, the Washington Post wrote an article on the church cle and found they still had 84 chartered members. But due to COVID affecting two of their pastors, the effects led to the church closing by 2021. The board discussed not being aware of the issues facing this church until it was to late.

Also the discussion of helping churches with a committee for conflict resolution by appointing a board liaison was discussed. The goal was to create a system to prevent churches from closing or buildings being neglected or members feeling lost due to lack of national support.

A new archival committee was discussed to help preserve our history and help the NSAC secretary with digitizing our archival documents and books. Contact the NSAC secretary if you have any Spiritualist history materials to donate.

Overall, the first convention since COVID was full of discussions, concerns and socialization. By Wednesday, the delegates were notified that a few attendees tested positive for COVID and by week end, many were coughing and sneezing,. Even our own church members who represented Church of Peace went home sick from this convention Over 30 delegates tested positive for Covid from participating in the convention.

Seeing faces that we have only met through Zoom was a joy and even though many of us went home sick, being a part of voting in a new board and passing bylaws that benefited moving our churches into the new digital and virtual era was worth it. Next convention is rumored to be in Buffalo, NY in October of 2023.







Church of Peace, A Spiritualist Center is dedicated to the research of Spiritualism.

Through our research we discovered that the Rev. Bertha Crear, was the First Black American Spiritualist to hold credentials with the

National Spiritualist Association and Spiritualist National Union in 1922. We were able to gather information about her and her contributions to Spiritualism. While researching, we discovered that there was only a cement number marking her burial spot in Columbus, Ohio. This saddened us.

Harvest recipe to warm the soul:



Butternut Squash Soup

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 white onion, peeled and diced
- 4 cloves garlic, peeled and minced
- 2 cups vegetable broth
- 1 carrot, peeled and roughly chopped
- 1 Granny Smith apple, cored and roughly chopped
 1 medium (about 3-4 lb) butternut squash, peeled, seeded and diced
- 1 sprig fresh sage
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne
- pinch of ground cinnamon and nutmeg
- 1/2 cup unsweetened coconut milk
- fine sea salt and freshly-cracked black pepper, to taste optional garnishes: extra coconut milk, smoked paprika or pumpkin seeds

Slow Cooker Butternut Squash Soup:

Slow cook: Add the oil (optional), onion, garlic, vegetable broth, carrot, apple, butternut squash, sage, cayenne, cinnamon and nutmeg to a small (4-quart) slow cooker or large (6-quart) slow cooker. Toss briefly to combine. Cook for 4-6 hours on low, or 2-3 hours on high, or until the squash is completely tender and mashes easily with a fork. Remove and discard the sage. Stir in the coconut milk.

Purée: Use an <u>immersion blender</u> to purée the soup until smooth. (Or alternately, see instructions in the notes below for how to purée the soup safely using a traditional blender.)

Season and serve: Taste and season the soup generously with salt and pepper as needed. Serve warm, topped with your desired garnishes, and enjoy!

Stovetop Butternut Squash Soup:

Sauté the onion and garlic. Heat the olive oil in a large stockpot over medium-high heat. Add the onion and sauté for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally, until softened and translucent. Add the garlic and sauté for 1 to 2 more minutes, stirring frequently, until fragrant.

Simmer: Add the vegetable broth, carrot, apple, butternut squash, sage, cayenne, cinnamon and nutmeg and stir to combine. Continue cooking until the soup reaches a simmer. Then cover, reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer for 20-30 minutes until the vegetables are all tender and mash easily with a fork. Remove and discard the sage. Stir in the coconut milk.

Purée: Use an <u>immersion blender</u> to purée the soup until smooth. (Or alternately, see instructions in the notes below for how to purée the soup safely using a traditional blender.)

Season and serve: Taste and season the soup generously with salt and pepper as needed. Serve warm, topped with your desired garnishes, and enjoy!






Equal Spirits





SPIRITUALISM: YESTERDAY, TODAY AND TOMORROW

Soldiers still serving after death-Military Spirits Try to Communicate

Spiritualism will flourish after the Civil war with families seeking séances and mediums to connect with loved ones who never made it home. First Lady Mary Todd Lincoln practiced séance and Spiritualism at the White House, helping grieving families connect with hose who perished in the war. The most haunted locations with apparitions of soldiers from the Civil War are at the Devil's Den , <u>Little Round Top</u> and Slaughter Pen areas of <u>Gettysburg</u>, Beauregard Keyes House in <u>New Orleans</u>, Antietam Battlefield, and <u>Andersonville Prison and Cemetery</u>. Today, <u>many still claim to see these spirits roam the battlefields</u>.

By WWI, the massive death tolls of the overseas fighting left many with a need to connect and say goodbye. Sir Oliver Lodge, a British physicist, and his parents became Spiritualists after WWI when they discovered they could communicate with their lost loved one through séances and mediums. Sir Oliver's book Raymond: Or life and Death is about the communication with his brother, BEF Soldier Raymond Lodge, who died at the Battle of Ypres in 1915. With so many sons and fathers unable to be buried at home, the ability to receive a Spirit message brough comfort to many who were grieving in the overseas wars.

World War II has many stories of hauntings and apparitions that fueled paranormal investigations. The <u>USS Hornet is considered</u> the most haunted ship in America's Navy with over 300 deaths aboard her decks and hundreds accounts of apparitions of soldiers since 1945. The <u>USS Arizona which was sunk during the Pearl Harbor invasion reportedly has apparitions</u> that interreact with those who visit the memorial site. Fort Leavenworth is considered the most haunted post in America which claims the spirit of General Custer to a young priest who died in a chapel fired in 2000 can be seen. The Rookery is the most haunted building at Fort Leavenworth with hundred of spectral visitors and rapping.

In 1972, apparitions started appearing at the barracks of the famous West Point Academy. The first apparition was of an 1830s solder who would appear in a barracks room 4717 and then disappear. Clairvoyants Eric and Lorraine Warren investigated the barracks by having a séance and psychic investigation. In their investigation they also found other spirits at the Academy, including an Irish laundress names Molly and an African American soldier named Private Lawrence Greer of the 9th Calvary who "reportedly" disappeared in 1931. His spirit was known to move objects and interact with guests.

Today a group of veterans have created a Military Veterans Paranormal group to investigate and research military paranormal events and sightings. Visit their site to learn more: https://militaryveteransparanormal.com/

DECLARATIONS OF PRINCIPLES
